He noted that the Jaycees help so many organizations on a regular basis. They cook for the Special Olympics soccer, track & field and softball competitions each year. They also cook for the Glenwood football games and Chatham's Homecoming for the American Legion. They have provided \$2,000 - \$2,500 scholarships each year and have built 2 playgrounds the last several years along with other park improvements.

His favorite event is "Clothes for Kids". Each holiday season, they take about 80 needy children shopping for clothes at Meijer. Each child is assigned a personal shopper, and is bought clothing to keep them warm through the winter. Teachers tell them that the children's confidence and self-esteem skyrockets the following week when they come to school in nice new clothing that fits and looks good.

Rollo was actively involved with Boy Scouts from 1997 to 2010 and continues to work and advise Eagle Scout Projects. He said that exposing flatland scouts to the wonders of Yellowstone, Mt. Rushmore, whale watching in Maine, Gettysburg, camping on the USS Yorktown and numerous ski trips to Wisconsin were very gratifying. He and his family joined other scout families to plant seedlings that are now the 20' pine trees that line the south and east sides of Chatham Community Park. Rollo has donated over 100 pints of blood, manned the phones for WSEC Telethons for at least 12 years, was an active volunteer at the ALPLM on Wednesday nights from 2005 -2009, a member of the Village of Chatham Public Properties and Recreation Commission since Nov. 2011, served on one of three United Way of Central Illinois funding boards, a founding member of Friends of Chatham Parks, chairman of the Chatham "Light Up the Park" holiday light display, member of Greater Chatham Chamber of Commerce sponsored Tree Committee and participated in all but one of the Chamber sponsored cleanup days. He has acted as Santa for teacher friends over the years and has played the role for schools that his employer, Horace Mann, adopted over the past nine years.

Rollo said that volunteering rarely feels like a burden. You can achieve great satisfaction by helping to make a difference. He has met many interesting people while working on various projects. He has always tried to live by the outdoor code of "leave it better than you found it."
